A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the service of Texas state teachers of the year and 3 other outstanding educators as advisors to regional and state 4 education agencies.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

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6 SECTION 1. Subsection A, Chapter 7, Education Code, is 7 amended by adding Section 7.007 to read as follows:

8 <u>Sec. 7.007. (a) The Texas Advisory Committee of Educators</u> 9 <u>is established to advise the agency, the board, and the State Board</u> 10 <u>for Educator Certification on matters relating to state education</u> 11 <u>policy and rulemaking. The commissioner, board, or State Board for</u> 12 <u>Educator Certification may submit a specific issue to the committee</u> 13 <u>for its consideration and advice.</u>

(b) The advisory committee is composed of educators who are 14 recognized for excellence in their profession. The number of 15 educators on the advisory committee is determined by the 16 commissioner, but may not be less than five. Each teacher who is 17 18 selected as a state teacher of the year under a program adopted by the agency serves as a member of the committee. The commissioner 19 shall appoint the remaining members of the committee. The 20 21 commissioner may appoint classroom teachers who have received state 22 or national recognition or are otherwise recognized for excellence 23 in education. The commissioner may request nominations from entities that award teaching excellence, regional education 24

1	service centers, or other entities selected by the commissioner.
2	(c) A state teacher of the year serving on the advisory
3	committee serves a two-year term beginning on the first day of the
4	teacher's term as state teacher of the year. The remaining members
5	serve staggered two-year terms concurrent with the state teachers
6	of the year serving on the committee.
7	(c-1) The commissioner shall designate the terms of the
8	initial members of the advisory committee, including teachers of
9	the year, in a manner that results in the terms of subsequent
10	members being staggered so that approximately one-half of the terms
11	expire each year. This subsection expires September 1, 2010.
12	(d) The commissioner shall designate a member of the
13	advisory committee to serve as the presiding officer. The advisory
14	committee shall meet at the call of the presiding officer.
15	(e) A member of the advisory committee is not entitled to
16	compensation for service on the committee but is entitled to
17	reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in
18	performing committee duties.
19	(f) Staff members of the agency shall provide
20	administrative support for the committee.
21	SECTION 2. Section 61.076, Education Code, is amended by
22	adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows:
23	(c-1) A teacher who is selected as the state teacher of the
24	year under a program adopted by the Texas Education Agency is
25	entitled to serve as a nonvoting member of the council. A state
26	teacher of the year serving on the council as provided by this
27	subsection serves a two-year term beginning on the first day of the

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teacher's term as state teacher of the year.

SECTION 3. Section 8.003(b), Education Code, is amended to 2 3 read as follows:

4 (b) The commissioner shall adopt rules to provide for the 5 local selection, appointment, and continuity of membership of regional education service center boards of directors. T<u>he rules</u> 6 must provide that a teacher who is selected as a regional teacher of 7 8 the year under a program adopted by the agency is entitled to serve 9 as a nonvoting member of the board of directors for that region.

10 SECTION 4. Section 22.003, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows: 11

12 (a-1) A school district that employs a person who is serving on a committee, council, or board under Sections 7.007, 8.003(b), 13 14 or 61.076(c-1) shall permit the employee to attend the meetings of 15 the committee, council, or board. The district may not require an employee to use state minimum personal leave granted under this 16 17 section for that purpose, but may require the employee to use personal leave provided beyond the state minimum if the employee 18 19 has such leave available.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
