## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study and report of the feasibility of providing a
- 3 health passport to children receiving Medicaid or enrolled in the
- 4 state child health plan program.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. (a) In this section:
- 7 (1) "Child health plan program" means the state child
- 8 health plan program authorized by Chapter 62, Health and Safety
- 9 Code.
- 10 (2) "Medicaid" means the medical assistance program
- 11 provided under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code.
- 12 (b) The Health and Human Services Commission shall conduct a
- 13 study of the feasibility of providing a health passport for:
- 14 (1) children under 19 years of age who are receiving
- 15 Medicaid and are not provided a health passport under another law of
- 16 this state; and
- 17 (2) children enrolled in the child health plan
- 18 program.
- 19 (c) The feasibility study must:
- 20 (1) examine the cost-effectiveness of the use of a
- 21 health passport in conjunction with the coordination of health care
- 22 services under each program;
- 23 (2) identify any barriers to the implementation of the
- 24 health passport developed for each program and recommend strategies

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- for the removal of those barriers;
- 2 (3) examine whether the use of a health passport will
- 3 improve the quality of care for children described in Subsection
- 4 (b) of this section; and
- 5 (4) determine the fiscal impact to this state of the
- 6 proposed initiative.
- 7 (d) Not later than January 1, 2009, the Health and Human
- 8 Services Commission shall submit to the governor, lieutenant
- 9 governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and presiding
- 10 officers of each standing committee of the legislature with
- 11 jurisdiction over the commission a written report containing the
- 12 findings of the study and the commission's recommendations.
- 13 (e) This Act expires September 1, 2009.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
