A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a kindergarten-plus pilot project for certain children.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	Article I. Definitions.
5	(1) The "commissioner" means the Texas Education
6	Commissioner.
7	(2) The "agency" means the Texas Education Agency.
8	(3) "Economically disadvantaged" means:
9	(A) Students from a family with an annual income
10	at or below the official poverty line; or,
11	(B) Students eligible for Temporary Assistance
12	for Needy Families or other public assistance; or,
13	(C) Students who received a Pell Grant or
14	comparable state program of need-based financial assistance; or,
15	(D) Students eligible for programs assisted
16	under Title II of the Job Training Partnership Act; or,
17	(E) Students eligible for Benefits under the Food
18	Stamp Act of 1977.
19	Article II. Kindergarten-Plus Program Pilot Project.
20	Subchapter E, Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding
21	Section 29.162 to read as follows:
22	SECTION 1. Duties of the Commissioner of Education.

(1) Establish a three-year study that extends approved

(a) The commissioner shall:

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- 1 full-day kindergarten programs by 40 instructional days for certain
- 2 students in eligible school districts;
- 3 (2) Award grants to eligible school districts from
- 4 funds appropriated for the purpose;
- 5 (3) Adopt rules necessary to administer this section,
- 6 including campus application requirements, procedures for
- 7 evaluating applications for grants;
- 8 (4) Provide standards and a curriculum for the
- 9 Kindergarten-Plus program;
- 10 (5) Establish district reporting and evaluation
- 11 requirements.
- 12 SECTION II. Eligible Districts.
- 13 (a) This act applies to districts which reported to the
- agency more than 56,000 students enrolled in 2005-2006, and,
- 15 (b) Who reported more than 81 percent of the student
- 16 population as economically disadvantaged or eligible for free or
- 17 reduced lunch in 2005-2006.
- 18 (c) A district may use funds received under this subsection
- only for the purpose of the district's Kindergarten-Plus program.
- 20 (d) A school district Kindergarten-Plus program must, at a
- 21 minimum, consist of:
- 22 (1) twenty additional instruction days for an eligible
- 23 child during the summer before the child will begin kindergarten;
- 24 and,
- 25 (2) twenty additional instruction days for an eligible
- 26 child during the summer after the child completes kindergarten.
- 27 (3) a curriculum based on improving numeracy, literacy

- 1 and social skills in students.
- 2 (e) A school district receiving funds under this section
- 3 shall:
- 4 (1) Demonstrate that its Kindergarten-Plus program
- 5 will meet all state standards and employ only qualified teachers
- 6 and other staff.
- 7 (2) Compensate teachers at the same rate and under the
- 8 same terms for Kindergarten-Plus as teachers are paid for regular
- 9 full-day kindergarten programs.
- 10 (3) A teacher who teaches a Kindergarten-Plus program
- 11 is entitled to two additional professional development days each
- 12 school year.
- 13 (4) Employ a sufficient number of teachers as provided
- 14 by Section 25.112 of this section.
- 15 (5) Notify the population in the district whose
- 16 children are eligible for enrollment in Kindergarten-Plus of the
- 17 availability of the class. The system must include public notices
- 18 issued in English and Spanish.
- 19 SECTION III. Student eligibility.
- 20 (a) A child is eligible to participate in a school
- 21 district's Kindergarten-Plus program if the:
- 22 (1) Child's parent or guardian has applied for the
- 23 child to participate in the kindergarten-plus program in the time
- 24 and manner required by the district and the district has accepted
- 25 the child's application;
- 26 (2) Child qualified for a pre-kindergarten program
- 27 under Section 29.153 of this section prior to reaching school

- 1 eligibility under Section 25.001 of this section; or,
- 2 (3) Child is entitled to attend school in the district
- 3 under Section 25.001 of the Education Code; and the child is:
- 4 (A) Unable to speak and comprehend the English
- 5 language; or,
- 6 (B) Educationally disadvantaged as established
- 7 under 42 U.S.C.S. Section 1751 et seq.; or,
- 8 (C) Homeless, as defined by 42 U.S.C Section
- 9 11302 regardless of the residence of the child, of either parent of
- 10 the child, or of the child's guardian or other person having lawful
- 11 control of the child.
- 12 (b) A child enrolled in Kindergarten-Plus remains eligible
- 13 for the duration of the program, regardless of financial status.
- 14 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- of this Act, the commissioner shall adopt rules relating to the
- 16 kindergarten-plus program provided for by Section 29.1511,
- 17 Education Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
