A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the pilot program to provide health services to state 3 employees in state office complexes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 Section 1. Chapter 671.001 of the Government Code is 6 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 671.001. NURSE PRACTITIONER O<u>R PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT</u> IN 7 STATE OFFICE COMPLEXES; PILOT PROGRAM. (a) To reduce the cost of 8 health care and increase the wellness and productivity of state 9 employees, the Employees Retirement System of Texas shall develop 10 and implement a pilot program to make available a licensed advanced 11 12 practice nurse or a licensed physician assistant to provide 13 authorized on-site health services at a selected location to state employees who choose to make use of the services. 14

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(b) The pilot program must provide for the following:

(1) a licensed advanced practice nurse as defined by
Section 301.152, Occupations Code, or a licensed physician
<u>assistant as defined by Section 204.001, Occupations Code</u> who is
employed by the state or whose services are acquired by contract,
who will be located at a state office complex;

(2) a licensed physician, who is employed by a state
governmental entity for purposes other than the pilot program or
whose services are acquired by contract, who will perform all
supervisory functions described by Section 157.052(e), Occupations

1 Code;

(3) appropriate office space and equipment for the
advanced practice nurse <u>or physician assistant</u> to provide basic
medical care to employees at the state office complex where the
nurse <u>or physician assistant</u> is located; and

6 (4) professional liability insurance covering 7 services provided by the advanced practice nurse <u>or the physician</u> 8 <u>assistant</u>.

9 (c) The board of trustees of the Employees Retirement System 10 of Texas shall adopt rules necessary for implementation of this 11 section and shall seek the assistance of state agencies as 12 necessary for the implementation of this chapter.

(d) The Employees Retirement System of Texas shall determine whether it is more efficient to pay directly for some or all of the expenses associated with implementing this chapter or to reimburse expenses through an interagency agreement as the expenses are incurred by an agency participating in the program.

(e) The Employees Retirement System of Texas may order the
pilot program continued or expanded to cover more state office
complexes on finding:

(1) the pilot program has proven beneficial in meetingthe health care needs of state employees; and

(2) continuation or expansion of the pilot program iseconomically beneficial.

25 Section 2. As soon as possible after the effect of this Act, 26 the board of trustees of the Employees Retirement System of Texas 27 shall adopt rules as required by Section 671.001, Government Code,

 Section 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
