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1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study by the Texas Water Development Board regarding 3 the impact of climate change on surface water supplies from the 4 portion of the Rio Grande in Texas subject to the Rio Grande Compact. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "board" means the Texas 7 Water Development Board. 8 SECTION 2. STUDY. (a) The board, in coordination with the 9 Far West Texas Regional Water Planning Group established pursuant 10 to Section 16.053, Water Code, shall conduct a study regarding the 11 12 possible impact of climate change on surface water supplies from 13 the Rio Grande. 14 (b) In conducting the study, the board shall convene a 15 conference within the Far West Texas regional water planning area designated pursuant to Section 16.053, Water Code, to review: 16 any analysis conducted by a state located to the 17 (1)west of this state regarding the impact of climate change on surface 18 water supplies in that state; 19 any other current analysis of potential impacts of 20 (2) climate change on surface water resources; and 21 22 (3) recommendations for incorporation of potential 23 impacts of climate change into the Far West Texas Regional Water Plan, including potential impacts to the Rio Grande in Texas 24

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subject to the Rio Grande Compact and identification of feasible
water management strategies to offset any potential impacts.

3 (c) The conference should include, but not be limited to, 4 the participation of representatives of:

5	(1)	the Far West Texas Regional Water Planning Group;
6	(2)	water authorities;
7	(3)	industrial customers;
8	(4)	agricultural interests;

9 (5) municipalities;

10 (6) fishing or recreational interests;

11 (7) environmental advocacy organizations; and

12 (8) institutions of higher education.

13 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than December 31, 2008, the 14 board shall submit to the legislature a written report regarding 15 the study findings under Section 2 of this Act.

16 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 17 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 18 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 19 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 20 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
