- SECTION 1. Article 59.06(h), Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended to read as follows:
 - (h) As a specific exception to the requirement Subdivisions (1)-(3) of Subsection (c) of this article that the funds described by those subdivisions be used only for the official purposes of the attorney representing the state or for law enforcement purposes, on agreement between the representing the state or the head of a law enforcement agency and the governing body of a political subdivision, the attorney representing the state or the head of the law enforcement agency may [shall] comply with the request of the governing body to deposit not more than a total of 10 percent of the gross amount credited to the attorney's or agency's fund into the treasury of the political subdivision. The governing body of the political subdivision shall, by ordinance, order, or resolution, use funds received under this subsection for:
- 20 (1) nonprofit programs for the prevention of drug 21 abuse;
- 22 (2) nonprofit chemical dependency treatment 23 facilities licensed under Chapter 464, Health and Safety Code;
- 24 (3) nonprofit drug and alcohol rehabilitation or

- 1 prevention programs administered or staffed by professionals
- 2 designated as qualified and credentialed by the Texas Commission on

- 6 SECTION 2. Article 59.06, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 7 amended by adding Subsections (r), (s), and (t) to read as follows:
- 8 <u>(r) As a specific exception to the requirement of</u>
- 9 Subdivisions (1)-(3) of Subsection (c) that the funds described by
- 10 those subdivisions be used only for the official purposes of the
