- Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 6.702, Family Code, is amended 5 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as 6 7 follows:
- Except as provided by Subsection (c), the [The] court 8 may not grant a divorce before the 60th day after the date the suit 9 was filed. A decree rendered in violation of this subsection is not 10 subject to collateral attack. 11
  - (c) A waiting period is not required under Subsection (a) before a court may grant a divorce in a suit in which the respondent has been finally convicted of an offense an element of which included the respondent assaulting or threatening the petitioner.
- SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 16 to a suit for dissolution of a marriage filed on or after the 17 effective date of this Act. A suit for dissolution of a marriage 18 filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law 19 in effect on the date the suit was filed, and the former law is 20 continued in effect for that purpose. 21
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 24
