S.B. No. 1790

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the requirements for receiving approval to provide 3 training to an owner of an on-site sewage disposal system using 4 aerobic treatment in maintaining the system.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 366.0515, Health and Safety Code, is 7 amended by amending Subsections (h), (n), and (o) and adding 8 Subsections (p) and (q) to read as follows:

(h) If the owner of an on-site sewage disposal system using 9 aerobic treatment for a single-family residence elects to maintain 10 the system directly, the owner must obtain [from the manufacturer 11 12 or installer of the system] an amount of on-site training specified 13 by commission rule, not to exceed six hours, from an approved trainer under Subsection (p) [either at the time of acceptance of 14 15 the system from the installer or at the time of an on-site maintenance visit by a maintenance company under the initial term 16 of the maintenance contract for the system, if applicable]. The 17 training must include instruction regarding the importance to 18 public health and safety of proper maintenance of the system and a 19 demonstration of the procedure for performing a scheduled 20 On the owner's completion of the training, the 21 maintenance. 22 approved trainer [manufacturer or installer] shall provide the 23 owner with a certificate or letter stating that the owner has 24 received the required training. An owner who elects to maintain the

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1 owner's system is subject to any inspection and reporting 2 requirements imposed by an authorized agent or the commission under 3 Subsection (k) applicable to a maintenance company that contracts to maintain a system. [If the residence is sold, the new owner, not 4 5 later than the 30th day after the date the owner takes possession of 6 the property, must obtain the training required by this subsection 7 from an installer certified by the manufacturer of the system under Subsection (n) or contract with a maintenance company for the 8 maintenance of the system.] 9

A person must be certified by the manufacturer of an 10 (n) on-site sewage disposal system using aerobic treatment to maintain 11 the system under a maintenance contract with the owner of the system 12 [or to provide training to the owner in maintenance of the system]. 13 A manufacturer may not unreasonably withhold certification and, 14 except as otherwise provided by this subsection, must offer the 15 16 certification to persons who are not employees of the manufacturer 17 on the same terms as the manufacturer offers the certification to 18 the manufacturer's employees. To be certified by a manufacturer, a person who is not an employee must: 19

(1) successfully complete a course approved by the
commission that provides up to 32 hours of training in maintenance
of on-site sewage disposal systems using aerobic treatment;

(2) be employed by a maintenance company at least oneemployee of which holds a license as:

(A) an installer, if the commission recognizesonly one level of installer; or

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(B) the highest level of installer recognized by

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1 the commission, if the commission recognizes more than one level of 2 installer;

3 (3) meet all of the manufacturer's criteria and 4 requirements for entering into a business relationship; and

5 (4) satisfactorily complete any other reasonable 6 requirements imposed by the manufacturer for certification.

7 (0) Subsection (n) does not allow the commission or an authorized agent to dictate to the manufacturer of on-site sewage 8 disposal systems using aerobic treatment the person who 9 is 10 authorized to maintain the systems [or to provide training in maintenance of the systems] in a particular area. That subsection 11 merely facilitates the expansion of the pool of persons who are 12 qualified to maintain [or to provide training in maintenance of] 13 those systems and protects the rights of owners and manufacturers 14 15 of those systems.

16 (p) A person must be approved by the commission to provide 17 training to the owner of an on-site sewage disposal system using 18 aerobic treatment in maintenance of the system. To be approved by 19 the commission, a person must:

20 (1) successfully complete a course approved by the 21 commission that provides up to 32 hours of training in maintenance 22 of on-site sewage disposal systems using aerobic treatment;

23 (2) hold a license as an installer and be employed by a 24 maintenance company, or if the person does not hold a license as an 25 installer or is not employed by a maintenance company, meet 26 additional requirements for approval as determined by the 27 commission; and

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1	(3) satisfactorily complete any other reasonable
2	requirements imposed by the commission for approval.
3	(q) In this section, "training provider" means an
4	administrative entity or individual approved by the commission to
5	provide training under this section.
6	SECTION 2. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality
7	shall be prepared to accept applications for the approval described
8	by Subsection (p), Section 366.0515, Health and Safety Code, as
9	added by this Act, not later than March 1, 2008.
10	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
