5	SECTION 1. Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, is amended
6	by adding Subchapter I to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER I. SALE OF SALVIA DIVINORUM
8	Sec. 161.091. SALE OF SALVIA DIVINORUM TO PERSONS YOUNGER
9	THAN 18 YEARS OF AGE PROHIBITED; PROOF OF AGE REQUIRED. (a) A
10	person commits an offense if the person, with criminal negligence:
11	(1) sells, gives, or causes to be sold or given salvia
12	divinorum to someone who is younger than 18 years of age; or
13	(2) sells, gives, or causes to be sold or given salvia
14	divinorum to another person who intends to deliver it to someone who
15	is younger than 18 years of age.
16	(b) If an offense under this section occurs in connection
17	with a sale by an employee of the owner of a store in which salvia
18	divinorum is sold at retail, the employee is criminally responsible
19	for the offense and is subject to prosecution.
20	(c) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
21	(d) It is a defense to prosecution under Subsection (a)(1)
22	that the person to whom the salvia divinorum was sold or given
23	presented to the defendant apparently valid proof of

identification.

- 1 (e) A proof of identification satisfies the requirements of 2 Subsection (d) if it contains a physical description and photograph 3 consistent with the person's appearance, purports to establish that the person is 18 years of age or older, and was issued by a 4 governmental agency. The proof of identification may include a 5 driver's license issued by this state or another state, a passport, 6 7 or an identification card issued by a state or the federal 8 government.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
