A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1(a), Chapter, Acts of the 77th
6	Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, is amended to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1. CREATION. (a) A navigation district, to be known
8	as the [Jefferson County Waterway and Navigation District]
9	Sabine-Neches Navigation District of Jefferson County, Texas, is
10	created in Jefferson County, subject to approval at a confirmation
11	election under Section 10 of this Act. The district is a
12	governmental agency and a body politic and corporate.
13	SECTION 2. Section 2, Chapter, Acts of the 77th
14	Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, is amended to read as follows:
15	Sec. 2. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
16	(1) "Commissioners court" means the Jefferson County

21	SECTION 3. Chapter, Acts of the 77th Legislature,
22	Regular Session, 2001, is amended by adding Section 6(c) as
23	follows:
24	SECTION 6(c) AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE SECURITY AND LAW

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1 ENFORCEMENT FOR SHIP CHANNELS AND WATERWAYS.

2 (1) The commission of the District may pass, amend, 3 repeal and enforce any ordinance rule, or police regulation which 4 is not contrary to the constitution or laws of this state and the 5 United States and which is necessary to: 6 (i) protect, secure and defend ship

7 <u>channels</u>, waterways and facilities the waterway serves within its 8 <u>boundaries and outside but adjacent to its boundaries and extending</u> 9 into the Gulf of Mexico.

10 (ii) to promote the health, safety and 11 general welfare of persons using the ship channels and waterways 12 within its boundaries; and

13 (iii) to require compliance with the laws and regulations of and/or to implement the directives and standards 14 15 of the United States government (including without limitation the 16 Department of Homeland Security and the United States Coast Guard) 17 relating to securing ship channels ,waterways and served facilities 18 and preventing terrorist attacks on ship channels, waterways, maritime facilities associated therewith and facilities that the 19 20 waterways serve.

21 (2) In the enforcement of any ordinance, rule or 22 regulation of the District, any sheriff, constable, or other duly 23 constituted peace officer of the State of Texas or any peace officer 24 employed or appointed by the commission may make arrests, serve 25 criminal warrants, subpoenas or writs, and perform any other 26 service or duty which may be performed by any sheriff, constable, or 27 other duly constituted peace officer of the State of Texas in

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enforcing other laws of this State. 1 (c) Any ordinance rule or police regulation adopted 2 3 pursuant to subsection (a) shall be adopted in accordance with the procedures provided in Sections 60.074-60.075, Texas Water Code. 4 5 (d) The District may enter into one or more interlocal agreements with the State of Texas, one or more counties, 6 7 municipalities and other political subdivisions of the State of Texas to jointly provide security for the ship channels and 8 waterways within the District's boundaries and to share in the 9 costs thereof. To protect the public interest, the district may 10 contract with a qualified party, including the federal government 11 or Jefferson County, for the provision of law enforcement services 12 in all or part of the district for a fee. The district may establish 13 fees, charges, and tolls to offset the cost of any law enforcement 14 15 services provided by any such qualified party. 16 (e) The District may fix proper fees, charges and tolls for 17 the use of ship channels and waterways in its jurisdiction and any 18 other revenues or funds of the District to provide security for the

19 ship channels and waterways as provided herein.

20 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 21 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 22 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 23 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 24 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
