A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the vaccination against bacterial meningitis of certain
3	first-time students at public institutions of higher education.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 51.9192 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 51.9192. BACTERIAL MENINGITIS VACCINATION REQUIRED 8 FOR CERTAIN STUDENTS; EXCEPTIONS. (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "Health practitioner" means any person authorized
 10 by law to administer an immunization.
- 11 (2) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
 12 assigned by Section 61.003.
- (b) This section applies only to a first-time student of an institution of higher education, including a transfer student, who resides in, or has applied for on-campus housing and been approved to reside in, an on-campus dormitory or other on-campus student housing facility at the institution.
- 18 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), before
 19 registering for any course at an institution of higher education, a
 20 student to whom this section applies or a parent or guardian of the
 21 student must provide to the institution a certificate signed by a
 22 health practitioner evidencing that the student has been vaccinated
 23 against bacterial meningitis.
- 24 (d) A student to whom this section applies or a parent or

- 1 guardian of the student is not required to comply with Subsection
- 2 (c) if the student or a parent or guardian of the student submits to
- 3 <u>the institution of higher education:</u>
- 4 (1) an affidavit or a certificate signed by a
- 5 physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine
- 6 in the United States in which it is stated that, in the physician's
- 7 opinion, the vaccination required would be injurious to the health
- 8 and well-being of the student; or
- 9 (2) an affidavit signed by the student stating that
- 10 the vaccination conflicts with the tenets and practice of a
- 11 recognized church or religious denomination of which the student is
- 12 an adherent or member, except that the exemption provided by this
- 13 <u>subdivision does not apply in times of emergency or epidemic</u>
- 14 declared by the commissioner of state health services.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 51.9192, Education Code, as added by
- this Act, applies only to first-time students enrolling in public
- 17 institutions of higher education in this state on or after January
- 18 1, 2008.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
