## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the creation of judicial districts, the creation of the
3	office of district attorney in certain counties, and the election
4	and duties of certain district attorneys in certain counties.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. (a) Subchapter C, Chapter 24, Government Code,
7	is amended by adding Section 24.562 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 24.562. 418TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT (MONTGOMERY COUNTY).
9	(a) The 418th Judicial District is composed of Montgomery County.
10	(b) The 418th District Court shall give preference to family
11	law matters.
12	(b) The 418th Judicial District is created on the effective
13	date of this section.
14	SECTION 2. (a) Subchapter C, Chapter 24, Government Code,
15	is amended by adding Section 24.567 to read as follows:
16	Sec. 24.567. 423RD JUDICIAL DISTRICT (BASTROP, BURLESON,
17	LEE, AND WASHINGTON COUNTIES). The 423rd Judicial District is
18	composed of Bastrop, Burleson, Lee, and Washington Counties.
19	(b) The 423rd Judicial District is created on the effective
20	date of this section.
21	SECTION 3. (a) Effective January 1, 2009, Subchapter C,
22	Chapter 24, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 24.573 to
23	read as follows:
24	Sec. 24.573. 429TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT (COLLIN COUNTY). The

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1	429th Judicial District is composed of Collin County.
2	(b) Effective January 1, 2009, the 429th Judicial District
3	is created.

7	(a) The 435th Judicial District is composed of Montgomery County.
8	(b) The 435th District Court shall give preference to:
9	(1) civil commitment proceedings under Chapter 841,
10	Health and Safety Code; and
11	(2) criminal cases involving offenses under Section
12	841.085, Health and Safety Code, and Article 62.203, Code of
13	Criminal Procedure.
14	(c) Notwithstanding any other law, the state shall pay the
15	salaries of and other expenses related to the court reporter
16	appointed for the 435th District Court under Section 52.041 and the
17	court coordinator appointed for the court under Section 74.101.
18	The salaries of the court reporter and court coordinator shall be
19	set in amounts commensurate with the salaries paid by other
20	district courts for those positions.
21	(b) The 435th Judicial District is created on the effective
22	date of this section.
23	SECTION 5. (a) Subchapter C, Chapter 24, Government Code,
24	is amended by adding Section 24.589 to read as follows:
25	Sec. 24.589. 445TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT (CAMERON COUNTY).
26	(a) The 445th Judicial District is composed of Cameron County.
27	(b) The 445th District Court shall give preference to

1 criminal law cases. 2 (b) The 445th Judicial District is created on the effective 3 date of this section. 4 SECTION 6. (a) Subchapter C, Chapter 24, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 24.592 to read as follows: 5 Sec. 24.592. 448TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT (EL PASO COUNTY). The 6 7 448th Judicial District is composed of El Paso County. The 448th Judicial District is created on the effective 8 (b) 9 date of this section. 10 SECTION 7. (a) Subchapter C, Chapter 24, Government Code, 11 is amended by adding Section 24.593 to read as follows: Sec. 24.593. 449TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT (HIDALGO COUNTY). 12 13 (a) The 449th Judicial District is composed of Hidalgo County. (b) The 449th District Court shall give preference to 14 juveni<u>le matters.</u> 15 16 (b) The 449th Judicial District is created on the effective date of this section. 17 SECTION 8. (a) Subchapter C, Chapter 24, Government Code, 18 is amended by adding Section 24.5995 to read as follows: 19 20 Sec. 24.5995. 506TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT (GRIMES AND WALLER COUNTIES). The 506th Judicial District is composed of Grimes and 21 22 Waller Counties. The local administrative district judge shall transfer 23 (b) all cases from Waller County that are pending in the 9th District 24 25 Court to the 506th District Court on the date the 506th District 26 Court is created. 27 (c) When a case is transferred as provided by Subsection (b)

of this section, all processes, writs, bonds, recognizances, or other obligations issued from the 9th District Court are returnable to the 506th District Court as if originally issued by that court. The obligees on all bonds and recognizances taken in and for the 9th District Court and all witnesses summoned to appear in the 9th District Court are required to appear before the 506th District Court as if originally required to appear before that court.

(d) The 506th Judicial District is created on the date the 8 Office of Court Administration of the Texas Judicial System 9 certifies to the comptroller of public accounts and commissioners 10 courts of Grimes and Waller Counties that the office has determined 11 that the current five-year average population per court for the 12 district courts that serve Grimes and Waller Counties and are in 13 existence as of January 1, 2007, is greater than the current 14 15 statewide five-year average population per district court.

SECTION 9. (a) Subchapter D, Chapter 24, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 24.640 to read as follows:

18 Sec. 24.640. 444TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT (CAMERON COUNTY). The
 19 444th Judicial District is composed of Cameron County.

(b) The 444th Judicial District is created on the effectivedate of this section.

22 SECTION 10. (a) Subchapter E, Chapter 24, Government Code, 23 is amended by adding Section 24.908 to read as follows:

24 <u>Sec. 24.908. EL PASO COUNTY CRIMINAL JUDICIAL DISTRICT NO.</u> 25 <u>1. (a) The El Paso County Criminal Judicial District No. 1 is</u> 26 <u>composed of El Paso County.</u>

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(b) The El Paso County Criminal District Court No. 1 shall

1	give primary preference to felony drug cases and associated civil
2	cases emanating from those felony drug cases. The criminal
3	district court shall give secondary preference to other criminal
4	cases and associated civil cases emanating from those criminal
5	cases.
6	(c) The terms of the El Paso County Criminal District Court
7	No. 1 begin on the third Mondays in April and September and the
8	first Mondays in January, July, and November.
9	(d) The El Paso County Criminal District Court No. 1 shall
10	have a seal similar to the seal of a district court with "El Paso
11	County Criminal District Court No. 1" engraved on the seal.
12	(b) The El Paso County Criminal Judicial District No. 1 is
13	created on the effective date of this section.
14	SECTION 11. Section 43.119, Government Code, is amended to
15	read as follows:
16	Sec. 43.119. 33RD JUDICIAL DISTRICT. The voters of <u>Blanco</u> ,
17	Burnet, Llano, and San Saba Counties [the 33rd Judicial District]
18	elect a district attorney for the 33rd and 424th Judicial
19	Districts.
20	SECTION 12. Section 43.148, Government Code, is amended to
21	read as follows:
22	Sec. 43.148. 105TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT. (a) The voters of
23	Nueces County [the 105th Judicial District] elect a district
24	attorney for the 105th Judicial District who[. The district
25	attorney] has the same powers and duties as other district
26	attorneys and serves all the district, county, and justice courts
27	of Nueces County [and the district courts of Kleberg and Kenedy

1 counties].

2 (b) The district attorney shall attend each term and session 3 of the district, county, and justice courts of Nueces County [and 4 the district courts of Kleberg and Kenedy counties] and shall 5 represent the state in criminal cases pending in those courts. The 6 district attorney has control of any case heard on petition of writ 7 of habeas corpus before any district or inferior court in the 8 district.

9 (c) The commissioners court [courts] of Nueces County [the 10 counties comprising the district ] may supplement the state salary 11 of the district attorney. The amount of the supplement may not exceed \$12,000 a year. [The supplemental salary must be paid 12 proportionately by the commissioners court of each county according 13 to the population of the county.] The supplemental salary may be 14 paid from the officers' salary fund of the  $[\frac{1}{2}]$  county. If that fund 15 is inadequate, the commissioners court may transfer the necessary 16 funds from the general fund of the county. 17

SECTION 13. Subchapter B, Chapter 43, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 43.182 to read as follows:

20 <u>Sec. 43.182. DISTRICT ATTORNEY FOR KLEBERG AND KENEDY</u> 21 <u>COUNTIES. (a) The voters of Kleberg and Kenedy Counties elect a</u> 22 <u>district attorney. The district attorney has the same powers and</u> 23 <u>duties as other district attorneys and serves the district courts</u> 24 <u>of Kleberg and Kenedy Counties.</u>

25 (b) The district attorney shall attend each term and session 26 of the district courts of Kleberg and Kenedy Counties and shall 27 represent the state in criminal cases pending in those courts. The

district attorney has control of any case heard on petition of writ 1 of habeas corpus before any district or inferior court in the 2 3 district. 4 (c) The commissioners courts of the counties comprising the district may supplement the state salary of the district attorney. 5 The amount of the supplement may not exceed \$12,000 a year. 6 The 7 supplemental salary must be paid proportionately by the commissioners court of each county according to the population of 8 the county. The supplemental salary may be paid from the officers' 9 10 salary fund of a county. If that fund is inadequate, the commissioners court may transfer the necessary funds from the 11 12 general fund of the county. 13 SECTION 14. Section 46.002, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 14 Sec. 46.002. PROSECUTORS SUBJECT TO CHAPTER. 15 This chapter 16 applies to all county prosecutors and to the following state 17 prosecutors: (1) 18 the district attorneys for Kenedy and Kleberg

SECTION 15. Effective January 1, 2009, Section 46.002, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

16 Sec. 46.002. PROSECUTORS SUBJECT TO CHAPTER. This chapter 17 applies to all county prosecutors and to the following state 18 prosecutors:

9 (3) the county attorneys performing the duties of 10 district attorneys in the counties of Andrews, Callahan, Cameron, 11 Castro, Colorado, Crosby, Ellis, Falls, Fannin, Freestone, Lamar, 12 Lamb, Lampasas, Lee, Limestone, Marion, Milam, Morris, Ochiltree, 13 Orange, Rains, Red River, Robertson, Rusk, Terry, Webb, and 14 Willacy.

SECTION 16. Except as otherwise provided by this Act, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
