S.B. No. 2027

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a border crossing initiative and issuance of an 3 enhanced driver's license or personal identification certificate by the Department of Public Safety. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 521, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 521.032 to read as follows: 7 8 Sec. 521.032. ENHANCED DRIVER'S LICENSE OR PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CERTIFICATE. (a) The department may issue an 9 enhanced driver's license or personal identification certificate 10 11 for the purposes of crossing the border between this state and 12 Mexico to an applicant who provides the department with proof of United States citizenship, identity, and state residency. If the 13 department issues an enhanced driver's license or personal 14 identification certificate, the department shall continue to issue 15 a standard driver's license and personal identification 16 certificate and offer each applicant the option of receiving the 17 standard or enhanced driver's license or personal identification 18 19 certificate. (b) The department shall implement a one-to-many biometric 20 21 matching system for the enhanced driver's license or personal 22 identification certificate. An applicant for an enhanced driver's 23 license or personal identification certificate must submit a 24 biometric identifier as designated by the department, which,

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notwithstanding any other law, may be used only to verify the 1 2 identity of the applicant for purposes relating to implementation of the border crossing initiative established by this section. An 3 4 applicant must sign a declaration acknowledging the applicant's 5 understanding of the one-to-many biometric match. 6 (c) The enhanced driver's license or personal 7 identification certificate must include reasonable security measures to protect the privacy of the license or certificate 8 holders, including reasonable safeguards to protect against the 9 unauthorized disclosure of information about the holders. If the 10 enhanced driver's license or personal identification certificate 11 includes a radio frequency identification chip or similar 12 technology, the department shall ensure that the technology is 13 14 encrypted or otherwise secure from unauthorized information 15 access. (d) The requirements of this section are in addition to any 16 17 other requirements imposed on applicants for a driver's license or personal identification certificate. The department shall adopt 18 rules necessary to implement this section. The department shall 19 periodically review technological innovations related to the 20 21 security of driver's licenses and personal identification certificates and amend the rules as appropriate, consistent with 22 this section, to protect the privacy of driver's license and 23

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25 <u>(e) The department may set a fee for issuance of an enhanced</u> 26 <u>driver's license or personal identification certificate in a</u> 27 reasonable amount necessary to implement and administer this

2 (f) The department may enter into a memorandum of understanding with any federal agency for the purposes of 3 4 facilitating the crossing of the border between this state and Mexico. The department may enter into an agreement with Mexico, to 5 6 the extent permitted by federal law, to implement a border crossing initiative authorized by this section. The department shall 7 implement a statewide education campaign to educate residents of 8 9 this state about the border crossing initiative. The campaign must include information on: 10 (1) the forms of travel for which the existing and 11 enhanced driver's license and personal identification certificate 12 can be used; and 13 (2) relevant dates for implementation of laws that 14 15 affect identification requirements at the border with Mexico. 16 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, thisAct takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
