2	relating to coverage for bariatric surgical procedures for certain
3	state employees.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 6, Government Code, is amended
6	by adding Chapter 672 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 672. BARIATRIC SURGERY BENEFITS FOR STATE EMPLOYEES
8	Sec. 672.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "state agency"
9	means a department, institution, commission, or other agency of the
10	state.
11	Sec. 672.002. PROVISION OF BENEFIT. (a) In this section,
12	"service" means personal service to the state creditable in
13	accordance with rules adopted by the board of trustees of the
14	Employees Retirement System of Texas.
15	(b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a state agency may
16	use available public funds to provide to an employee of the state
17	agency with at least five years of service coverage for the expenses
18	of bariatric surgical procedures.
19	(c) Coverage may not be provided to an employee under this
20	section to the extent that coverage is available to the employee
21	under Chapter 1551, Insurance Code.
22	SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 1551, Insurance Code, is
23	amended by adding Section 1551.228 to read as follows:
24	Sec. 1551.228. COVERAGE FOR BARIATRIC SURGICAL PROCEDURES.

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A group health benefit plan offered under the group benefits 1 2 program must provide an employee with at least five years of service coverage for bariatric surgical procedures that is at least as 3 extensive as the benefit for bariatric surgery provided to Medicare 4 beneficiaries under the National Coverage Determinations Manual 5 6 published by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services on 7 February 15, 2006.

SECTION 3. (a) An interim committee is created to study 8 9 the cost that the state can be expected to incur and the benefits the state can be expected to realize by providing the coverage for 10 bariatric surgical procedures for state employees required by 11 Section 1551.228, Insurance Code, as added by this Act. The 12 committee's study must include, to the extent feasible, a study of 13 the costs incurred and benefits realized by any political 14 15 subdivision of the state that has provided benefits for bariatric surgical procedures to the employees of the political subdivision. 16 17 A political subdivision that provides a benefit described by this subsection shall provide the committee with any information related 18 to the provision of those benefits, other than information that 19 would identify the recipient of the benefit. 20

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The committee consists of the following five members: (b)

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(1) two senators appointed by the lieutenant governor; (2) two representatives appointed by the speaker of 23 24 the house of representatives; and

(3) one member appointed by the governor, who shall 25 26 serve as the committee's presiding officer.

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The committee shall convene at the call of the presiding (c)

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1 officer.

(d) The committee has all other powers and duties provided to a special or select committee by the rules of the senate and house of representatives, by Subchapter B, Chapter 301, Government Code, and by policies of the senate and house committees on administration.

From the contingent expense fund of the senate and the 7 (e) 8 contingent expense fund of the house of representatives equally, 9 the members of the committee are entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this Act in 10 accordance with the rules of 11 the senate and house of representatives and the policies of the senate and house committees 12 on administration. 13

(f) Not later than January 15, 2009, the committee shall 14 15 report the committee's findings and recommendations to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, 16 17 and the governor. The committee shall include in its recommendations specific statutory changes that appear necessary 18 or advisable from the results of the committee's study under 19 Subsection (a) of this section, including changes to the 20 eligibility requirements or benefit levels under Section 1551.228, 21 Insurance Code, as added by this Act, or the repeal of that section. 22

(g) Not later than the 60th day after the effective date of this Act, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the governor shall appoint the members of the interim committee created under this section.

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(h) This section expires September 1, 2009.

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1 SECTION 4. The change in law made by Section 1551.228, 2 Insurance Code, as added by this Act, applies to health benefit 3 plans provided under Chapter 1551, Insurance Code, beginning with 4 the 2010-2011 plan year.

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5 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
