SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Members of the Texas State Association of 3 Parliamentarians are visiting the Capitol on May 4 and 5, 2007, in 4 conjunction with their annual convention in Austin, and the 5 occasion provides a fitting opportunity to honor this commendable 6 organization; and

7 WHEREAS, Since 1955, the Texas State Association of 8 Parliamentarians has served the people of Texas through the study, 9 teaching, and dissemination of parliamentary law, while its members 10 have served a multitude of public and private organizations in the 11 practice of fair and expedient procedure; and

WHEREAS, Passed to the American colonies from the British House of Commons, parliamentary law was nurtured in the colonial legislature and developed in the United States Congress and state legislatures, and it remains the hallmark of integrity in American government; and

17 WHEREAS, In February 1876, General Henry M. Robert, a former 18 chief of the United States Army Corps of Engineers, published 19 Pocket Manual of Rules of Order for Deliberative Assemblies, better 20 known as Robert's Rules of Order; interestingly, the author of the 21 most widely used manual of parliamentary procedure also played a 22 role in the design and construction of the Galveston Seawall and the 23 Houston Ship Channel near the turn of the 20th century; and

24 WHEREAS, The Lone Star State is home to many notable

parliamentarians, including the late Robert E. Johnson, Sr., who was honored for his longtime service to the Texas Legislature with the dedication of the Robert E. Johnson, Sr., State Legislative Office Building; renowned Texas and United States legislator Barbara Jordan emphasized the importance of parliamentary procedure when she stated, "If you're going to play the game properly, you'd better know every rule"; and

8 WHEREAS, The members of the Texas Legislature, as well as the 9 citizens of the State of Texas, owe a debt of gratitude to the 10 parliamentarians, secretaries, and clerks of the Texas Senate and 11 House of Representatives, for their skillful, equitable, and 12 efficient execution of session business is integral to ensuring the 13 integrity and consistency of the legislative process in the Lone 14 Star State; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the 80th Legislature of the State of Texas hereby recognize May 5, 2007, as Parliamentary Law Day at the State Capitol and extend to the members of the Texas State Association of Parliamentarians sincere best wishes for a memorable and rewarding convention in Austin.
