2 WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State of Texas joins citizens 3 across our country in setting aside April 15 through 22 as the Days 4 of Remembrance in honor of the victims of the Holocaust; and

5 WHEREAS, The history of the Holocaust offers an opportunity 6 to reflect on the moral responsibilities of individuals, societies, 7 and governments; and

8 WHEREAS, The citizens of our state and nation should remember 9 the terrible events of the Holocaust and remain vigilant against 10 hatred, persecution, and tyranny; and

11 WHEREAS, It is also of great importance that our citizens 12 become rededicated to the principles of individual freedom in a 13 just society; and

14 WHEREAS, The Days of Remembrance have been set aside for the 15 people of our nation to remember the victims of the Holocaust as 16 well as to reflect on the need for respect of all peoples; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to an Act of Congress, the United States Holocaust Memorial Council has designated the Days of Remembrance of the victims of the Holocaust to be Sunday, April 15, through Sunday, April 22, including the Day of Remembrance known as Yom Hashoah, April 15; and
