1 CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Dr. Hatlen encouraged educators and leaders at schools for the blind and visually impaired to redefine their institutions as multiservice agencies that provide for the best interests of their students, and he emphasized that those interests are best served by qualified teachers and an effective partnership between parents and educators; and
