WHEREAS, The county seat, Nacogdoches, is the oldest city in Texas and received its official designation from the Mexican government in 1779; it was home to the state's first newspaper, Gaceta de Tejas, and today, the city maintains such significant historic landmarks as the Old Stone Fort, which figured prominently in the quest for Texas' independence; and

WHEREAS, Located in the Piney Woods of East Texas, known also as "Texas Forest Country," Nacogdoches County boasts a fertile forestland, which provides residents with a thriving timber business and a prosperous agribusiness; and

WHEREAS, With its natural beauty and charm,
Nacogdoches County also lends itself to ample recreational
activities and outdoor events; the Sam Rayburn Reservoir and
Angelina National Forest are both popular sites for camping,
hiking, and fishing; the Texas Blueberry Festival, held annually
the second week in June, is a notable event that celebrates the
county's thriving blueberry industry; the county is also one of
the first three Certified Retirement Communities in Texas; and

WHEREAS, Higher education is an important part of daily life for residents of the city of Nacogdoches, as it is the home of the respected Stephen F. Austin State University, which supports the local economy and infuses the city with a youthful energy and spirit; and

WHEREAS, A unique and vibrant Texas county,

Nacogdoches County has played an indelible role in the history of

Texas, and it is appropriate to take this opportunity to pay

tribute to its residents for their preservation of their region's

past and their many contributions to the Lone Star State; now,
