WHEREAS, Mr. Orem returned to San Antonio in 1947 and earned a bachelor's degree in education and a master's degree in biology from Trinity University; in 1953, he began a long and exemplary career with Alamo Heights Independent School District; and

WHEREAS, During his tenure with the district, he served as a coach, teacher, assistant to the superintendent, assistant principal, high school principal, assistant superintendent, and acting superintendent; after his retirement in 1994, he served as a school board trustee; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Orem was a devout Christian who practiced his faith in his daily life, and he was an active member of Alamo Heights Baptist Church; and

WHEREAS, He met Mary Ann Hawkins at Cambridge, while he was a coach and she was a first-grade teacher, and he married her in June of 1948; she preceded him in death after 58 years of marriage; and

WHEREAS, A man of courage, strength, and generosity, he gave unselfishly to others, and his wisdom, kindness, and compassion will not be forgotten by those who knew him; and

WHEREAS, A devoted husband, father, and grandfather, he will continue to live in the hearts and minds of those he left behind; now, therefore, be it
