WHEREAS, Henry Porretto was born on Galveston Island on July 16, 1928, and lived most of his working life in Galveston; he graduated from Kirwin High School, where he played on the varsity football team, was senior class president, and was named "Most Popular"; and

WHEREAS, He attended The University of Texas at Austin and the University of Houston and earned degrees in petroleum engineering and geology; he was proud to have served in the United States Army during the Korean War; he married the former Rosemarie Matijevich in 1956; and

WHEREAS, After working for a time with his father in the oil industry, he went into business for himself; he acquired real estate and developed the beachfront property known as Porretto Beach; he operated the business as a private park for over 40 years; and

WHEREAS, Henry Porretto was noted for his kindness and compassion for others; for many years, he donated the use of his property to such organizations as the Muscular Dystrophy Association, the Galveston Jaycees, and the Galveston County Sheriff's Department Beach Patrol; and

WHEREAS, He was a highly respected community leader and a member of such organizations as the Hotel Association of Galveston, the Galveston Park board of trustees, and the Galveston Lions Club; he was recognized twice as Lion of the Year and was honored multiple times with the Doctor Mihovil Award for Outstanding Leadership to the Welfare of his Community; and
