WHEREAS, When he left Vietnam, Terry left his Texas flag behind so that his fellow Texans could have the benefit of its good providence and fortune, and eventually the other two Texans returned home safely; Terry is truly deserving of recognition for his honorable service and his sacrifice on behalf of his country; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the State of Texas, 80th Legislature, hereby commend Terry Nixon for his exceptional service to our nation during the Vietnam War and extend to him best wishes in all his future endeavors; and, be it further
