WHEREAS, The Pro-Vision School combines traditional school curricula with educational techniques that emphasize social and economic empowerment; the school has created a safe haven for students where academic achievement exists side by side with social and developmental growth; and

WHEREAS, Manhood development was the basis upon which Pro-Vision, Incorporated, was founded; the Manhood Development Program has worked to develop thoughtful, critical-thinking, and respectful young men who take responsibility for their lives; and

WHEREAS, The Pro-Vision Enterprise Academy focuses on employment training and provides individuals with the stabilization and interpersonal skills they need to succeed in a mainstream business environment; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the State of Texas, 80th Legislature, hereby commend Pro-Vision, Incorporated, for the organization's dedication to preparing young men to prosper in today's world; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be prepared for Pro-Vision, Incorporated, as an expression of high regard from the Texas Senate.
