IN RE: HB32 by Berman (Relating to the penalty for discarding lighted smoking materials from a motor vehicle.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Health and Safety Code to create as a Class B misdemeanor offense the act of discarding from a motor vehicle a lighted match, a lighted cigarette or cigar, or other lighted smoking material.
