**IN RE: HB814** by Dutton (Relating to the payment of child support obligations on behalf of persons wrongfully imprisoned. ), **As Passed 2nd House**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would require the State to pay for current child support that accrues while a wrongfully imprisoned obligor is in prison. The Comptroller of Public Accounts indicates there would be no administrative costs for the agency; however, a cost to General Revenue may result for additional payments resulting from wrongful imprisonment.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
