**IN RE: HB1432** by Giddings (Relating to the assignment of a public school student to an inexperienced or uncertified teacher.), **As Introduced**

<b>No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b>
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Beginning in fiscal year 2008, for districts with enrollment of at least 5,000 students, the bill would prohibit students in grade 7 or higher in subjects for which they take an assessment and students in grades Kindergarten through 6 from being assigned for two consecutive school years to a teacher who either has less than one year of teaching experience or who does not hold the appropriate certificate issued by the State Board for Educator Certification unless a parent or guardian and school administrator agree to allow the assignment.

**Local Government Impact**

To the extent that school districts would need to hire additional teachers or more experienced teachers under the provisions of the bill, additional local cost could be incurred.
