IN RE: HB1984 by Thompson (Relating to the creation of a statewide autism spectrum disorders resource center.), Committee Report 1st House, Substituted

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend Chapter 114, Human Resources Code by adding Section 114.013. The bill would require Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) to establish and administer an autism spectrum disorders resource center, with the purpose of coordinating resources for individuals with autism and other pervasive developmental disorders and their families.

The HHSC would be required to collect and distribute information and research regarding autism and other pervasive developmental disorders, conduct training and development activities for individuals who may interact in the course of their employment with an individual with autism or other pervasive developmental disorders, coordinate with local entities that provide services to individuals with autism or other pervasive developmental disorders, and provide support for families affected by autism or other pervasive developmental disorders.

It is anticipated any additional work resulting from the passage of the bill could be reasonably absorbed within current resources.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
