**Fiscal Analysis**

The bill would amend the Health and Safety Code to exempt floor models from the regulatory requirements for secondhand bedding.

The bill would apply only to the sale of secondhand bedding on or after the effective date of this Act.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2007.

**Methodology**

The bill would exempt floor models from the regulatory requirements for secondhand bedding. Under current law, secondhand bedding is defined as bedding that has been previously used in any manner.

The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) anticipates that there would be a 2 percent reduction in the number of permits issued, which would result in an annual decrease in licensing revenue of \$2,090.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
