**IN RE: SB36** by Nelson (Relating to the examination of certain applicants for a license to practice medicine.), **Committee Report 2nd House, Substituted**

**No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill requires physician licensure applicants who, on September 1, 2005, held a physician-in-training (PIT) permit with the Texas Medical Board (TMB) or had a PIT application pending before TMB, to pass each part of a licensure examination within three attempts and pass the remaining part of the examination within six attempts.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
