**IN RE: SB763** by Duncan (Relating to the affidavit required to prove expenses in a civil action.), **As Engrossed**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

Under the provisions of the bill, a party, or party's attorney offering an affidavit in evidence required to prove expense in a civil action, would no longer be required to file the affidavit with the clerk of the court.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2007.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
