IN RE: SB895 by Seliger (Relating to limits on the size of prekindergarten classes in public

schools.), As Introduced

# No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would limit class enrollment in prekindergarten classes to no more than 22 students beginning with the 2007-08 school year. To meet this requirement, the Texas Education Agency estimates that school districts would need to hire an estimated 152 additional teacher full-time equivalents. Increases in total payroll have implications for the state's required contribution to the Teacher Retirement System (TRS). Assuming a 6 percent contribution rate, additional state TRS contributions associated with the provisions of the bill are estimated to be \$294,000 annually. If the state contribution rate for TRS were increased, state TRS costs associated with the bill would increase accordingly.

## **Local Government Impact**

It is estimated that 152 additional teacher full-time equivalents would be required to meet the 22-student class size limit. Costs associated with salary and benefits for the additional teachers are estimated to be \$6.5 million annually. The Texas Education Agency indicates that additional costs for facilities cannot be reasonably estimated with available data.
