**IN RE: SB1013** by Jackson, Mike (Relating to the authority of the Railroad Commission of Texas to regulate warning signs appurtenant to certain pipeline facilities; providing an administrative penalty. ), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would provide that the Railroad Commission has exclusive jurisdiction over warning signs for natural gas and hazardous liquid pipelines, gathering lines that are under the Commission's safety jurisdiction and distribution facilities. The bill would give the Railroad Commission rulemaking authority for such pipeline warning signs. Violations of rules relating to warning signs would result in penalties which would be deposited to the General Revenue-Dedicated Oil Field Cleanup Account No. 145.

According to the Railroad Commission, the bill would not add any significant workload to the agency.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
