IN RE: SB1828 by Whitmire (Relating to the use of certain electronically readable information on a driver's license to comply with certain alcohol related laws.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

This bill would amend the Alcoholic Beverage Code as it relates to the use of certain electronically readable information on a driver's license to comply with certain alcohol related laws. The Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission and the Texas Department of Public Safety do not anticipate significant fiscal impact as a result of complying with the provision of this bill.

The bill would take effect immediately if a two-thirds majority vote in both houses of the Legislature is received. Otherwise, the bill would take effect on September 1, 2007.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
