 Council for Building Healthy Families is established to:
- (1) facilitate communication and collaboration concerning policies for the prevention of and early intervention in child abuse and neglect among state agencies whose programs and services promote and foster healthy families;
- 22 (2) facilitate improvements in the coordination of 23 service delivery among those agencies;
- 24 (3) provide information and other resources to assist

- 26 <u>(4) receive input from those agencies in order to</u>
 27 <u>develop and improve policies for the prevention of and early</u>

- 2 (b) The council consists of one representative from each of 3 the following agencies appointed by the executive director or 4 commissioner of each agency:
 - (1) the Department of Family and Protective Services;

- 8 (4) the Department of Aging and Disability Services;
 - (5) the Texas Youth Commission;
- 10 (6) the Texas Education Agency;
- 11 (7) the Texas Workforce Commission;
- 12 (8) the office of the attorney general;
- 13 (9) the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission; [and]
- 14 (10) the Texas Department of Housing and Community
- 15 Affairs; and

- 18 (c) A representative of an agency appointed to the council 19 must have an overall understanding of the agency's mission and 20 purpose and substantial experience and expertise relating to the 21 administration of the agency's policies, programs, and activities.
- 22 (d) The representative from the Department of Family and 23 Protective Services serves as the presiding officer of the council.
- 24 (e) The council shall meet at least quarterly and shall submit to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the legislature the minutes of each council meeting.

(f) The council shall evaluate:
