No. 104-191). 7 The business associate, and any subcontractor of the business associate who receives the transferred information, may use the 8 9 information only to service or maintain the hospital's database of 10 the information.
- 11 (k) If an individual objects to the hospital collecting the 12 individual's information from the individual's driver's license as 13 described by Subsection (i), the hospital must use an alternative 14 method for collecting the individual's information.
