#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the offense of funeral service disruption.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 42.055(b), Penal Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (b) A person commits an offense if, during the period
- 7 beginning one hour before the service begins and ending one hour
- 8 after the service is completed, the person engages in picketing
- 9 within 1,000 [500] feet of a facility or cemetery being used for a
- 10 funeral service.
- 11 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 14 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the
- 15 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For the
- 16 purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the
- 17 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 18 before that date.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
