6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, is amended to read

11 Criminal Procedure;

12 (2) a county jailer as defined by Section 1701.001,
13 Occupations Code;

14 (3) an employee of the Texas Department of Criminal

16 (4) a commissioned security officer as defined by
17 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code; ~~and~~

18 (5) a victim of family violence as defined by Section
19 71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family violence
20 against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a Class A
21 misdemeanor; and

22 (6) an employee of a district attorney, criminal
23 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose
24 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services

2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
6 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
