H.B. No. 1311

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1
2 relating to requiring certain municipalities to disannex land owned
3 by a navigation district.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 43, Local Government Code,
6 is amended by adding Section 43.083 to read as follows:

7 Sec. 43.083. CERTAIN MUNICIPALITIES TO DISANNEX LAND OWNED
8 BY NAVIGATION DISTRICT. (a) A municipality with a population of
9 less than 30,000 that borders the Gulf of Mexico and that, before
10 the effective date of this Act and without the consent of the
11 district, annexed land owned by a navigation district operating
12 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, shall, not later
13 than January 1, 2008, disannex the land unless the district
14 notifies the municipality in writing that the district elects that
15 the land not be disannexed.

16 (b) This section expires January 1, 2010.

17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
21 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

3 Local Government Code, immediately following proposed Subsection
4 (a) (page 1, between lines 21 and 22), insert the following:

5 (b) A municipality that disannexes land under Subsection
6 (a) and that, on the effective date of this section, provides
7 utility services to customers on that land shall continue to
8 provide the services at the same rate until the first anniversary of
9 the effective date of this section.

10 (2) In SECTION 1 of the bill, in proposed Subsection (b),
11 Section 43.083, Local Government Code (page 1, line 22), strike
12 "(b)" and substitute "(c)".
