| 11 | 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, must have the consent of the |
| 12 | district to annex the land. |
| 13 | SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives |
| 14 | a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as |
| 15 | provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this |
| 16 | Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this |
| 17 | Act takes effect September 1, 2007. |
