- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 659.305, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a), (d), (e), (f), and (g) and adding
- 7 Subsection (h) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Except as provided by <u>Subsections</u> [<del>Subsection</del>] (b) <u>and</u>
- 9 (h), the amount of a full-time state employee's hazardous duty pay
- 10 for a particular month is the lesser of:
- 11 (1) \$10 for each 12-month period of lifetime service
- 12 credit accrued by the employee; or
- 13 (2) \$300.
- (d) For purposes of Subsections (a)(1), [and] (b)(2), and
- 15 (h), the number of 12-month periods of lifetime service credit that
- 16 the employee has accrued must be determined as of the last day of
- 17 the preceding month.
- (e) A state employee is considered to be a full-time state
- employee for purposes of Subsection (a), [ex] (b), or (h) if the
- employee is a full-time state employee for any portion of the first
- 21 workday of the month.
- 22 (f) The amount of a part-time state employee's hazardous
- 23 duty pay is proportional to the amount of a full-time state
- employee's pay under Subsection (a), [er] (b), or (h).
