H.B. No. 2702

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the exemption from tuition and fees at a public
3	institution of higher education for adopted students.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 54.2111(a), Education Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(a) A student is exempt from the payment of tuition and fees
8	authorized by this chapter if the student:
9	(1) was adopted; and
10	(2) was the subject of an adoption assistance
11	agreement under Subchapter D, Chapter 162, Family Code, that:
12	(A) provided monthly payments and medical
13	assistance benefits; and
14	(B) was not limited to providing only for the
15	reimbursement of nonrecurring expenses, including reasonable and
16	necessary adoption fees, court costs, attorney's fees, and other
17	expenses directly related to the legal adoption of the child.
18	SECTION 2. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
19	section, the change in law made by this Act applies beginning with
20	tuition and fees charged at a public institution of higher
21	education for the 2007 fall semester. Tuition and fees charged for
22	an academic period before the 2007 fall semester are covered by the
23	law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
24	the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

H.B. No. 2702

- The change in law made by this Act does not apply to a 1 student who was enrolled in a public institution of higher 2 education and qualified for an exemption from tuition and fees 3 under Section 54.2111(a), Education Code, for any academic term of 4 5 the 2006-2007 academic year. A student described by this 6 subsection is entitled to an exemption from tuition and fees under 7 Section 54.2111(a), Education Code, as that section existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, until the 8 9 earlier of:
- 10 (1) the date the student completes the degree program 11 in which the student was last enrolled in the 2006-2007 academic 12 year or another degree program of the same level; or
- 13 (2) the fourth anniversary of the date the student 14 initially enrolled in the degree program in which the student was 15 last enrolled in the 2006-2007 academic year.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

8	(b-1) The department shall pay a \$150 subsidy each month
9	for the premiums for health benefits coverage for a child with
10	respect to whom a court has entered a final order of adoption if
11	the child:
12	(1) was in the conservatorship of the department at
13	the time of the child's adoptive placement;
14	(2) after the adoption, is not eligible for medical
15	assistance under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code; and
16	(3) is younger than 18 years of age.
17	(b-2) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
18	Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement
19	Subsection (b-1), including rules that:
20	(1) limit eligibility for the subsidy under that
21	subsection to a child whose adoptive family income is less than
22	300 percent of the federal poverty level;
23	(2) provide for the manner in which the department
24	shall pay the subsidy under that subsection; and
25	(3) specify any documentation required to be provided
26	by an adoptive parent as proof that the subsidy is used to
27	obtain and maintain health benefits coverage for the adopted
28	child.

- 3 who does not receive any other subsidy under this section is not
- 4 considered to be the subject of an adoption assistance agreement
- 5 for any other purpose, including for determining eligibility for
- 6 the exemption from payment of tuition and fees for higher
- 7 education under Section 54.2111, Education Code.
- 8 (b) The change in law made by this section to Section
- 9 162.304, Family Code, applies only to financial and medical
- 10 assistance available under Section 162.304, Family Code, as
- 11 amended by this section, for a child for whom a final order of
- 12 adoption is entered on or after the effective date of this
- 13 section. Financial and medical assistance for a child for whom

Under provisions of the bill, a student is not eligible for the tuition exemption authorized by Section 54.2111(a) of the Education Code if the student's most recent adoption was an international adoption.
