BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4

SECTION 1. (a) The Texas Transportation Commission shall conduct a study of the feasibility of prioritizing the distribution of funds to highway projects that enhance federally designated emergency evacuation routes. The study must determine the sources of funds available for those projects.

- 15, 2009, the (b) Not later than January Transportation Commission shall submit to the legislature a written report containing the findings of the study and the commission's recommendations.
- This section expires September 1, 2009. 14

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 18 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would require the Texas Transportation Commission to conduct a study of the feasibility of prioritizing the distribution of funds to highway projects that enhance federally-designated emergency evacuation routes and determine the sources of funds available for such projects.

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) estimates the cost of the feasiblity study would be approximately \$250,000. Based on the analysis of TxDOT, it is assumed any costs and duties associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be absorbed within existing resources.

The bill would take effect immediately upon receiving a vote of two-thirds of all members elected to each house or otherwise on September 1, 2007.
