1           WHEREAS, Countless lives were touched by the kindness and  
2 boundless generosity of Eleanor Hall "Puddie" Pitcock of Houston,  
3 who passed away on May 14, 2009; and

4           WHEREAS, Raised in Dallas, Puddie Pitcock was the  
5 valedictorian of her Sunset High School graduating class; she moved  
6 to Houston in 1948 and earned a bachelor's degree in history from  
7 Rice University; and

8           WHEREAS, A philanthropist who did not ask for recognition,  
9 Mrs. Pitcock anonymously donated numerous religious sculptures and  
10 works of art to churches and cathedrals across the country, and one  
11 such gift was presented to Mikhail Gorbachev for his role in ending  
12 the Cold War; and

13           WHEREAS, Mrs. Pitcock also found ways to give to the homeless  
14 individuals in her community, and in demonstrating the utmost  
15 compassion and sensitivity, she became known as the "Angel of the  
16 Streets"; she helped cover medical and dental expenses for those in  
17 need, and she served on the board of Covenant House and supported  
18 numerous other organizations, including the Salvation Army, Star of  
19 Hope, and SEARCH Homeless Services; moreover, Mrs. Pitcock provided  
20 coats to local newspaper vendors during the holidays and was  
21 referred to on news programs as "The Coat Lady"; and

22           WHEREAS, In all of her endeavors, Mrs. Pitcock enjoyed the  
23 love and support of her husband, Doug, and the couple shared many  
24 rewarding years together, celebrating their 58th wedding

1 anniversary in January 2009; and

2 WHEREAS, A woman of strong faith, Puddie Pitcock inspired  
3 countless individuals with her selfless acts and her caring nature,  
4 and she will long be remembered with great admiration and  
5 affection; now, therefore, be it

6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas  
7 Legislature, 1st Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the life of  
8 Eleanor Hall Pitcock and extend sincere sympathy to the members of  
9 her family: to her husband, James D. Pitcock, Jr.; to her son, James  
10 D. Pitcock III; and to her other relatives and friends; and, be it
