### **BILL ANALYSIS**

H.B. 2804 By: Guillen Corrections Committee Report (Unamended)

## **BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE**

Under current law, district judges are paid an annual salary of \$125,000 by the state, and are allowed to earn up to \$15,000 in additional compensation for extra-judicial services performed by the district judge, which is provided by the county where a judge serves.

Currently, Duval County pays between \$1,200 and \$3,600 in additional compensation for a district judge's service in the capacity of a juvenile board member. The compensation cap for Duval County is one of the lowest among Texas counties.

H.B. 2804 raises the salary cap to \$10,000 to equalize the compensation paid to a juvenile board member in Duval County compared to other counties in Texas.

# **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

It is the committee's opinion that this bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, department, agency, or institution.

## **ANALYSIS**

H.B. 2804 amends the Human Resources Code to raise the cap on the annual salary paid to a Duval County Juvenile Board member from \$3,600 to \$10,000.
