AUTHOR'S / SPONSOR'S STATEMENT OF INTENT

Under Section 694.002 (Duty of Commissioners Court Concerning Disposition of Body of Deceased Paupers), Health and Safety Code, counties are required to provide for the disposition of a deceased pauper's body. This section authorizes the county to dispose of unidentified human remains by cremation. However, under Section 716.101 (Unidentified Human Remains), Health and Safety Code, a crematory is prohibited from accepting unidentified human remains.

- S.B. 571 is designed to alleviate overcrowding in counties whose health departments are at capacity for storage of unidentified human remains.
- S.B. 571 amends current law relating to a crematory establishment's authority to accept for cremation unidentified human remains.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Amends Section 716.101, Health and Safety Code, as follows:

Sec. 716.101. UNIDENTIFIED HUMAN REMAINS. (a) Creates this subsection from existing text. Creates an exception under Subsection (b).

(b) Authorizes a crematory establishment, notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, to accept for cremation unidentified human remains from a county on the order of the county commissioners court or a court located in the county.

SECTION 2. Effective date: upon passage or September 1, 2009.
