A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT
2 relating to supplemental appropriations to pay for damages and
3 disruptions suffered by state agencies and institutions of higher
4 education caused by natural disasters.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS FOR GENERAL COSTS CAUSED BY
7 NATURAL DISASTERS. The following amounts are appropriated out of
8 the economic stabilization fund to the following agencies and
9 institutions of higher education for the two-year period beginning
10 on the effective date of this Act for the purpose of paying for, or
11 reimbursing payments made for, costs incurred by the agencies or
12 institutions associated with damages or disruptions caused by
13 natural disasters that occurred before the effective date of this
14 Act during the state fiscal biennium that began September 1, 2007:

27 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS FOR LOST REVENUE AND BUSINESS

1 INTERRUPTION COSTS CAUSED BY NATURAL DISASTERS. The following
2 amounts are appropriated out of the economic stabilization fund to
3 the following agencies and institutions of higher education for the
4 two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the
5 purpose of paying for lost revenue and business interruption costs
6 suffered by the agencies or institutions associated with damages or
7 disruptions caused by natural disasters that occurred before the
8 effective date of this Act during the state fiscal biennium that
9 began September 1, 2007:

27 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS ALLOCATED TO APPROPRIATE GENERAL

1 APPROPRIATIONS ACT STRATEGIES. The agencies and institutions
2 receiving appropriations made by this Act shall allocate the
3 appropriations to the appropriate General Appropriations Act
4 strategies.

5 SECTION 4. REQUIRED VOTE FOR ECONOMIC STABILIZATION FUND
6 APPROPRIATIONS. This Act takes effect only if this Act receives a
7 two-thirds vote of the members present in each house as required by
8 Section 49-g, Article III, Texas Constitution.

9 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
10 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
11 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
12 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
13 immediate effect, then except as otherwise provided by this Act,
14 this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
15 legislative session.
