A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to establishing a health science center and medical school 3 in South Texas. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 74, Education Code, is amended by adding Subchapter N to read as follows: 6 7 SUBCHAPTER N. THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER--SOUTH TEXAS 8 Sec. 74.751. HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER. (a) The board of 9 regents of The University of Texas System may operate The 10 University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas as a 11 12 component institution of The University of Texas System with its main campus and administrative offices in Cameron County. The 13 14 health science center may consist of a medical school, as provided by Section 74.752, other health and health-related degree programs, 15 16 and related programs and facilities as the board considers 17 appropriate. (b) The board of regents may include facilities located in 18 Brooks, Cameron, Hidalgo, Jim Hogg, Kenedy, Kleberg, Starr, 19 Willacy, and Zapata Counties in the health science center and may 20 operate programs and activities and provide related services of the 21 center in those counties. 22 Sec. 74.752. MEDICAL SCHOOL. If The University of Texas 23 Health Science Center--South Texas is established under Section 24

1 74.751, The University of Texas Medical School--South Texas may be 2 established as a component of the health science center and as a 3 component institution of The University of Texas System under the 4 management and control of the board of regents of The University of 5 Texas System. Sec. 74.753. PARTICIPATION IN AVAILABLE UNIVERSITY FUND. 6 7 In accordance with Section 18(c), Article VII, Texas Constitution, 8 if the Act enacting this section receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house of the legislature, and if an 9 institution is established under this subchapter, the institution 10 is entitled to participate in the funding provided by Section 18, 11 12 Article VII, Texas Constitution, for The University of Texas 13 System. 14 Sec. 74.754. COURSES AND DEGREES; RULES. The board of regents may prescribe courses leading to customary degrees and may 15 adopt rules for the operation, control, and management of the 16 17 health science center as may be necessary for the conduct of a medical school and other health science center programs of the 18 19 first class. Sec. 74.755. AFFILIATION AGREEMENTS; JOINT APPOINTMENTS. 20 (a) The board of regents may execute and carry out affiliation or 21 22 coordination agreements with any other entity or institution in the 23 region. 24 (b) The board of regents may make joint appointments in the health science center, its component institutions, and other 25 26 institutions under the board's governance. The salary of a person who receives a joint appointment shall be apportioned to the 27

1 appointing institutions on the basis of services rendered. 2 Sec. 74.756. GIFTS AND GRANTS; OTHER FUNDING. (a) The 3 board of regents may accept and administer gifts and grants from any public or private person or entity for the use and benefit of the 4 5 health science center and its component institutions. 6 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter, 7 establishment of the health science center is subject to the availability of funding, either through appropriation or from 8 another source. 9 10 Sec. 74.757. OTHER FACILITIES. In addition to the facilities of the health science center and its component 11 12 institutions, the board of regents may enter into agreements under which additional facilities used in the center's teaching and 13 research programs, including libraries, auditoriums, research 14 15 facilities, and medical education buildings, may be provided by a 16 public or private entity. 17 Sec. 74.758. TEACHING HOSPITAL. A teaching hospital considered suitable by the board of regents for the health science 18 center may be provided by a public or private entity. The hospital 19 may not be constructed, maintained, or operated with state funds. 20 21 Sec. 74.759. COORDINATING BOARD SUPERVISION. The health 22 science center is subject to the continuing supervision of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Chapter 61 and to 23 24 the rules of the coordinating board adopted under Chapter 61. Sec. 74.760. EFFECT OF HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER ON LOWER RIO 25 26 GRANDE VALLEY ACADEMIC HEALTH CENTER. (a) The board of regents may convert the regional academic health center established under 27

1 Subchapter L into The University of Texas Health Science 2 Center--South Texas and may establish The University of Texas 3 Medical School--South Texas at the health science center as soon as the board considers appropriate considering available resources 4 5 and the best interests of The University of Texas System and the people of this state and the South Texas region. In establishing 6 7 the health science center and medical school, the board of regents shall ensure that the programs, students, and faculty and staff of 8 the regional academic health center are not affected other than as 9 10 the board considers necessary to implement this subchapter.

(b) It is the intent of the legislature that The University 11 12 of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas and its component institutions be established by conversion of the regional academic 13 health center established under Subchapter L and that those 14 entities be considered to be the same institution. A reference in 15 law to the regional academic health center applies to The 16 17 University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas to the extent it can be made applicable. All contracts and agreements, 18 19 including bonds and other financial obligations, entered into by The University of Texas System or any of its officers or employees 20 relating to the regional academic health center apply to The 21 22 University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas when the health science center is established. 23

(c) The permanent endowment fund established under Section
 63.101 for the benefit of the regional academic health center
 established under Subchapter L is transferred to the benefit of The
 University of Texas Health Science Center-South Texas and its

component institutions when the health science center is 1 established. It is the intent of the legislature that the transfer 2 of the permanent endowment fund be made so as not to interrupt the 3 research or other programs supported by distributions from the 4 5 fund. 6 SECTION 2. Section 55.1732, Education Code, is amended by 7 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows: 8 (e) Bonds authorized or issued under this section for the regional academic health center established under Section 74.611 9 are considered to have been authorized or issued for The University 10 of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas and its component 11 12 institutions if the health science center is established. SECTION 3. Section 61.003(5), Education Code, is amended to 13 14 read as follows: 15 (5) "Medical and dental unit" means The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston; The University of Texas 16 17 Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas; The University of Texas Medical School at San Antonio; The University of Texas Dental 18 Branch at Houston; The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer 19 Center; The University of Texas Graduate School of Biomedical 20 Sciences at Houston; The University of Texas Dental School at San 21 Antonio; The University of Texas Medical School at Houston; The 22 University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas and its 23 24 component institutions, if established under Subchapter N, Chapter 74; the nursing institutions of The University of Texas System; and 25 26 The University of Texas School of Public Health at Houston; and such other medical or dental schools as may be established by statute or 27

D. Anderson Cancer 22 Center, including: 23 24 (A) The University of Texas M. D. Anderson 25 Hospital; 26 (B) The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Tumor 27 Institute; and

(C) The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Science Park; and <u>(12) The University of Texas Health Science</u> Center--South Texas, including The University of Texas Medical

<u>School--South Texas, if established under Subchapter N, Chapter 74</u>.
SECTION 6. No funds for a state fiscal biennium ending on or
before August 31, 2015, may be appropriated for the purposes of
Subchapter N, Chapter 74, Education Code, as added by this Act.

9 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
