A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the authority of certain private institutions of higher

3 education to enter into mutual assistance agreements regarding the

4 enforcement of state or local law.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Sections 51.2125(a) and (c), Education Code, are

7 amended to read as follows:

- 8 (a) This section applies only to a private institution of
- 9 higher education that [has a fall head count enrollment of more than
- 10 10,000 students and that] has under its control and jurisdiction
- 11 property that is contiguous to, or located in any part within the
- 12 boundaries of, a home-rule municipality that has [with] a
- 13 population of $\underline{\text{1.18 million or}}$ more $\underline{\text{and is located predominantly in a}}$
- 14 county that has a total area of less than 1,000 square miles [than
- 15 one million]. For purposes of this section, a private institution
- 16 of higher education is a private or independent institution of
- 17 higher education as defined by Section 61.003.
- 18 (c) A mutual assistance agreement authorized by this
- 19 section may designate the geographic area in which the campus peace
- 20 officers are authorized to provide assistance to the peace officers
- 21 of the municipality, except that if the agreement is entered into
- 22 with a municipality described by Subsection (a) that elects all or
- 23 part of the municipality's governing body from election districts
- 24 [with a population of more than one million], the designated

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- 1 geographic area consists of each of the election districts of the
- 2 municipality's governing body that contains any part of the campus
- 3 of the institution and each of the election districts of the
- 4 governing body that is contiguous to another municipality that
- 5 contains any part of the campus of the institution.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- $7\,$ a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
