A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of the practice of dental hygiene. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 258.001, Occupations Code, is amended to 4 5 read as follows: 6 Sec. 258.001. [<u>IMPERMISSIBLE</u>] DELEGATIONS. (a) А dentist may not delegate: 7 8 an act to an individual who, by board order, is (1) prohibited from performing the act; 9 any of the following acts to a person not licensed 10 (2) 11 as a dentist or dental hygienist: 12 (A) the removal of calculus, deposits, or 13 accretions from the natural and restored surfaces of exposed human 14 teeth and restorations in the human mouth; 15 (B) root planing or the smoothing and polishing of roughened root surfaces or exposed human teeth; or 16 any other act the delegation of which is 17 (C) 18 prohibited by board rule; or (3) any of the following acts to a person not licensed 19 as a dentist: 20 21 (A) comprehensive examination or diagnosis and 22 treatment planning; a surgical or cutting procedure on hard or 23 (B) soft tissue; 24

No. 168 1 (C) the prescription of a drug, medication, or 2 work authorization; 3 (D) the taking of an impression for a final 4 restoration, appliance, or prosthesis; 5 (E) the making of an intraoral occlusal 6 adjustment; 7 (F) direct pulp capping, pulpotomy, or any other 8 endodontic procedure; 9 (G) the final placement and intraoral adjustment 10 of a fixed or removable appliance; or the placement of any final restoration. 11 (H) 12 (b) A dentist may delegate [; or [(4)] the authority to an individual to administer a 13 14 local anesthetic agent, inhalation sedative agent, parenteral 15 sedative agent, or general anesthetic agent if the individual is [not] licensed as: 16 17 (1) [(A)] a dentist, with a permit issued by the board for the procedure being performed  $[\tau]$  if a permit is required; 18 [<del>(B)</del>] a certified registered nurse anesthetist 19 (2) licensed by the Texas Board of Nursing, only if the delegating 20 dentist holds a permit issued by the board for the procedure being 21 performed[<sub>7</sub>] if a permit is required; [<del>or</del>] 22 [<del>(C)</del>] a physician anesthesiologist licensed by 23 (3) 24 the Texas Medical Board; or 25 (4) a dental hygienist, only if the procedure is the 26 administration of a local anesthetic agent under Section 27 262.002(a)(6).

Section 262.002, Occupations Code, is amended by 1 2 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as 3 follows: 4 A person practices dental hygiene if the person: (a) 5 (1) removes accumulated matter, tartar, deposits, 6 accretions, or stains, other than mottled enamel stains, from the restored surface of 7 natural and exposed human teeth and 8 restorations in the human mouth: 9 (2) smoothes roughened root surfaces; polishes exposed human teeth, restorations in the 10 (3) human mouth, or roughened root surfaces; 11 topically applies drugs to the surface tissues of 12 (4) the human mouth or the exposed surface of human teeth; 13 14 (5) makes dental x-rays; [and] 15 (6) administers intraoral, block, or infiltration anesthesia under direct supervision as required by this subtitle 16 17 after completion of a board-approved course; and (7) performs any other service, task, or procedure 18 prescribed by board rule. 19 (c) A dental hygienist may not establish an independent 20 21 practice to provide services authorized by this subtitle. SECTION 3. (a) The State Board of Dental Examiners, not 22 later than January 1, 2010, shall: 23 24 (1) prescribe by rule the requirements for a course to 25 train dental hygienists to administer local anesthetic agents; and (2) develop a procedure for the approval of courses 26 27 described by Subdivision (1).

No. 168 (b) A rule adopted under Subsection (a) of this section must 1 2 require that a course is: 3 (1) accredited by the Commission on Dental 4 Accreditation of the American Dental Association; and 5 (2) offered in a classroom setting at an educational institution. 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009. 7
