3	who agree to teach bilingual education, English as a second

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter FF to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER FF. FINANCIAL INCENTIVE PROGRAM TO PREPARE TEACHERS IN
9	BILINGUAL EDUCATION, ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE, AND SPANISH
10	Sec. 61.9771. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM. The board shall
11	establish a program to provide financial incentives such as tuition
12	assistance or student loan repayment to:
13	(1) assist persons to obtain certification to teach
14	bilingual education, English as a second language, or Spanish in a
15	public elementary or secondary school in this state; and
16	(2) facilitate the employment of those persons by a
17	public elementary or secondary school in this state that has a
18	shortage of teachers certified to teach in those fields.
19	Sec. 61.9772. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive
20	financial incentives under this subchapter, a person must:
21	(1) apply to the board in the form and manner
22	prescribed by board rule;
23	(2) have completed at least 60 semester credit hours
24	of coursework toward an associate's degree at a public junior

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1	college or a junior college accredited by a recognized accrediting
2	agency;
3	(3) be admitted into an educator preparation program
4	at an institution of higher education that prepares students for
5	certification to teach bilingual education, English as a second
6	language, or Spanish;
7	(4) enter into an agreement with the board as provided
8	by Section 61.9773; and
9	(5) satisfy any other criteria jointly prescribed by
10	the board and the State Board for Educator Certification.
11	Sec. 61.9773. AGREEMENT. To qualify for financial
12	incentives under this subchapter, a person must enter into a
13	written agreement with the board as provided by this section. The
14	agreement must require the person to:
15	(1) obtain, within the period prescribed by board
16	rule, certification to teach bilingual education, English as a
17	second language, or Spanish in a public elementary or secondary
18	school in this state;
19	(2) accept, during the first school year that begins
20	after the date the person becomes certified, an offer of full-time
21	employment to teach bilingual education, English as a second
22	language, or Spanish in a public elementary or secondary school in
23	this state that has a shortage of teachers certified to teach in one
24	or more of those fields; and
25	(3) teach bilingual education, English as a second
26	language, or Spanish at that school for at least two school years.
27	Sec. 61.9774. FINANCIAL INCENTIVES. The board shall award

financial incentives such as tuition assistance or student loan 1 2 repayment to each participant in the program to assist with the cost of payment of mandatory tuition and fees for courses required to 3 4 obtain certification to teach bilingual education, English as a 5 second language, or Spanish. 6 Sec. 61.9775. REIMBURSEMENT; EXCEPTIONS. (a) A program 7 participant who fails to meet the requirements of Section 61.9773 8 shall reimburse the board for the amount of any assistance received 9 by the participant under this subchapter. The board by rule shall establish exceptions to the 10 (b) reimbursement requirement under this section for participants who 11 12 are unable to meet the requirements of Section 61.9773 as a result of an unusual hardship. 13 14 Sec. 61.9776. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. In addition to 15 money appropriated by the legislature, the board may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations for the purposes of this 16 17 subchapter. Sec. 61.9777. RULES. The board shall adopt rules necessary 18 for the administration of this subchapter, including a rule that 19

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19 for the administration of this subchapter, including a rule that 20 sets the maximum amount of financial assistance that a person may 21 receive under this subchapter in one year.

SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall adopt rules for the administration of Subchapter FF, Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after this Act takes effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may adopt the initial rules in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
