Part 54, Subpart E, as 23 amended: 24 (6) finance the implementation and administration of

Chapter 56, Utilities Code, is amended by adding 13 14 Subchapter I to read as follows: 15 SUBCHAPTER I. TELEPHONE VOICE-MAIL GRANT PROGRAM 16 Sec. 56.351. TELEPHONE VOICE-MAIL-BOX ASSISTANCE GRANTS. 17 (a) The commission by rule shall establish and implement a commission program to provide from the universal service fund 18 19 funding for a grant program to assist the service administrators of telephone voice-mail-box services for individuals who are 20 homeless, are in transition, or cannot afford telephone services. 21 The grant program may not fully fund a voice-mail-box service 22 23 program. To be eligible for a grant under the program, the service 24 administrator must be: 25 (1) a publicly funded nonprofit organization; or 26 (2) an organization exempt from federal income tax

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under Section 501(a), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, by being

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1	listed as exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of that code.
2	(b) Rules adopted under this section must:
3	(1) include accountability measures and provisions
4	for loss of eligibility for failure to comply with the measures; and
5	(2) require grant recipients to provide the commission
6	with information on program outcomes.
7	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
